Victoria Woodhull was the first woman to run for President — before women could even vote!

Grandma Emma Gatewood was the first woman to solo thru-hike the 2,050-mile Appalachian Trail — at the age of 67.

Two documentaries tell the stories of these incredible trailblazers — the Emmy-nominated TRAIL MAGIC: THE GRANDMA GATEWOOD STORY and VICTORIA WOODHULL: SHATTERING GLASS CEILINGS.

Our special America 250 project is to create this new DVD to celebrate these two women who display the American spirit in unique ways. They blazed trails unheard of during their times. Victoria Woodhull challenged an entire political system when she ran for President in 1872.
